# **CURRICULUM**

Cutting-edge, dedicated, and flexible ambulatory care curriculum

Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) for substance use disorder, gender affirming hormone therapy, and HIV pre-exposure prohylaxis, medication and procedural abortion

Longitudinal training opportunities including adolescent medicine, research, sports medicine, academic medicine, and comprehensive reproductive health

Variety of procedures in both ambulatory and inpatient settings, including point-of-care ultrasound

# CALL

Interns: approximately seven 24-hour OB calls; supervised night float on adult and pediatrics rotations
