

Women Kidney Program Research Study

The purpose of this study is to see how kidney disease affects the health of adult women. We hope to do this by asking about your medical history and providing surveys for you to complete during your time enrolled.

Taking part in the Women Kidney Program is up to you. You can leave the study at any time, and we're here to help if you have any questions.

What does the study involve?

1. SCREENING VISIT



The study team is reviewing medical records to find people to participate in this study. If you appear to be a good fit, you will be asked to meet in person at the site most convenient to you: Minneapolis, Maple Grove, or Edina.

By joining the study, you will:

- Give us permission to review your medical history.
- Complete surveys provided to you by the study team.

2. MEDICAL REVIEW



The study team will review your medical records and medical history, which will include physical exams, medications, lab results, current and past diagnoses, and other details.

These medical reviews will occur twice per year for the entire time you are enrolled in the study.

3. STUDY SURVEYS



Surveys will be selected for you by the study team. These surveys may include questions:

- About your general health.
- About your quality of life.
- About your reproductive health.
- About your sexual health.

4. STUDY DURATION



Medical record review and study surveys will continue every year you are enrolled until you decide you no longer want to be in the study or until the study ends.

By being a part of this study you will help increase the knowledge and awareness of women living with kidney disease, as well as help improve their ability to manage the disease. You will be paid \$25 for your time.
